## Spring Course 2019

### **Traditional Lake District Buildings** **Led by Andy Lowe**

This series of seven talks will be held at Barbon Village Hall from 7.30 pm until 9.30 pm on Tuesday evenings commencing on 29<sup>th</sup> January. In addition to the talks there will be two field trips, on Saturdays 9<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> March.

Traditional buildings are an essential historic component of the distinctive Lake District landscape. This course looks in detail at the development of houses, farm buildings and industrial buildings. Special attention will be on recognising the use of local building materials, and the way that buildings show clear evidence of how people lived and worked in the past. The course encourages us to be 'building detectives' and gain both an understanding and enjoyment in looking at traditional buildings that we often take for granted.
